

Large Trees (greater than 30 feet in height)	
<b>Boxelder</b> - 'Sensation'	tolerant of alkaline soils, strong central leader, no boxelder bugs
<b>Buckeye/Horsechestnut</b> - Ohio Buckeye, Texas Buckeye, Yellow Buckeye, Horsechestnut	unique palmate leaves, upright white flowers, drought tolerant, yellow-orange fall color
<b>Cottonwood</b> - Plains 'Sargent Straight'	WY native, cottonless, very large tree, large roots at the surface
<b>Elm</b>	
American Elm 'Colonial Spirit', 'Prairie Expedition', 'Princeton'	vase-like crown shape, fast grower, highly tolerant to DED, hardy and very adaptable
Asian Elm 'Accolade', 'Discovery', 'New Horizon', 'Triumph'	vase-like crown shape, fast grower, highly resistant to DED, hardy and very adaptable
<b>Hackberry</b>	tolerant of alkaline soils, upright growth habit, good street tree
<b>Honeylocust</b> - 'Imperial', 'Northern Acclaim', 'Shademaster', 'Skyline'	very hardy and adaptable tree, small leaflets, allows sunlight to penetrate the crown, prone to sunscald
<b>Kentucky Coffeetree</b> - 'Espresso', 'Stately Manor'	sparse branching habit, compound leaves, seed pods, unique bark, no insect or disease problems
<b>Linden</b>	
American Linden 'Frontyard', 'Legend', 'Redmond', 'Sentry'	large heart-shaped leaves, hardy and adaptable tree, intolerant of de-icing salts
Littleleaf Linden 'Dropmore', 'Greenspire', 'Norlin', 'Shamrock'	pyramidal shaped crown, very upright growth habit, intolerant of de-icing salts
<b>Maple</b> - Norway 'Emerald Lustre', 'Emerald Queen', 'Deborah'	Prone to sunscald and leaf scorch on hot dry sites, prefers protected sites, large leaves provide good shade
<b>Oak</b>	
Bur Oak	WY native, rounded crown, hardy and tolerant of clay and alkaline soils
Chinkapin Oak	orange-red fall color, unique leaves, strong central leader
Red Oak	chlorotic in clay and alkaline soils, prefers protected sites

Small Trees (less than 30 feet in height)	
<b>Birch</b> River 'Heritage'	multi-stem tree, peeling bark, can become chlorotic in alkaline soils
<b>Chokecherry</b> Canada Red 'Sucker Punch'	fast growing, purple leaves, tends to sucker, susceptible to sunscald
<b>Crabapple</b> 'Adams', 'Dolgo', 'Prairiefire', 'Radiant', 'Royal Raindrops', 'Thunderchild'	wide variety of selections with varied flower/fruit colors and size ranges available
<b>Hawthorn</b> 'Downy', 'Russian', 'Thornless Cockspur', 'Toba'	wide variety of selections with varied flower/fruit colors and size ranges available, most have thorns
<b>Ironwood</b>	tolerant of alkaline soils, drought tolerant, hop-like looking leaves
<b>Japanese Tree Lilac</b> 'Ivory Silk'	small compact tree, abundant creamy white flowers in spring
<b>Maple</b>	
Bigtooth Maple	WY native, multi-stem habit, orange fall color
Tatarian Maple 'Hot Wings', 'Pattern Perfect'	hardy and adaptable, fast growing, orange-red fall color
<b>Mayday Tree</b>	white flowers, compact rounded canopy, tolerant of alkaline soils
<b>Mountain Ash</b> 'Cardinal Royal', 'Oakleaf', 'Showy'	white flowers with orange- red fruit, unique leaves, hardy and adaptable to most sites
<b>Pear</b>	
Callery Pear 'Autumn Blaze', 'Chanticleer'	upright growth habit, brilliant white flowers, prefers protected sites
Ussurian Pear 'Burgundy', 'Mt. Frost', 'Prairie Gem'	very hardy, upright oval form, white flowers, glossy green leaves turn orange-red in the fall

## Recommended Evergreen Trees for Cheyenne, WY

### Large Trees (greater than 30 feet in height)

<b>Large Trees (greater than 30 feet in height)</b>	
<b>Pine</b>	
<i>Austrian Pine</i>	Dense pyramidal shape; fast growing; requires full sun; dark green needles; tolerant to most soil types.
<i>Bosnian Pine</i>	Narrow, upright pyramidal shape; dense, dark green foliage; cones are a purple-blue; very hardy and requires full sun.
<i>Limber Pine- 'Vanderwolf's'</i>	WY native, densely branched, pyramidal in shape; drought, heat and salt resistant.
<i>Ponderosa Pine</i>	WY native, large, open-branched tree with long, medium green needles; older bark is orange-red in color, with large flakey plates; drought tolerant and very hardy
<i>Scotch Pine</i>	slow growing tree; somewhat drought tolerant; compact branching and pyramidal shape
<i>Southwestern White Pine</i>	Layered branches with a rounded crown; susceptible to salt spray; Struggles in poorly drained soils; ornamental cones
<b>Spruce</b>	
<i>Black Hills Spruce</i>	WY native, dense, slow growing, pyramidal in shape; drought tolerant
<i>Norway Spruce</i>	Moderately fast growing; dense, upright branches; long, narrow cones; needs protected site; somewhat drought tolerant.
<i>Engelmann Spruce</i>	Dense, narrow, and pyramidal shape; cold tolerant and transplants easily.
<i>Colorado Blue- 'Colorado Green'</i>	ornamental conifer with silvery-blue needles; tolerant to flooding and drought; wind tolerant
<b>White Fir</b>	conical shape; somewhat drought tolerant; very hardy; slow to medium growth
<b>Douglas Fir</b>	soft, pyramidal shape; medium to fast growth; drought sensitive
<b>Juniper</b>	
<i>Utah Juniper</i>	bushy, rounded crown; central dominant trunk; trunk is highly decay resistant; drought and alkaline tolerant.
<b>Cedar</b>	
<i>Eastern Red Cedar</i>	Pyramidal growth with dense foliage; tolerant of adverse conditions and varied soil types. Should not be planted near apple trees.
<b>Larch</b>	
<i>Western Larch</i>	Soft, green needles that turn yellow and fall off in the fall; sensitive to frost damage; tolerant to a variety of soils

### Small Trees (less than 30 feet in height)

<b>Small Trees (less than 30 feet in height)</b>	
<b>Juniper</b>	
<i>Spartan Juniper</i>	Upright, fast growing, highly durable; tolerant to heat, cold, drought, and salt; very hardy
<i>Rocky Mountain Juniper, Cologreen Juniper</i>	Upright, small landscape tree; columnar pyramidal shape; non-flowering; susceptible to blight
<i>Grey Gleam Juniper</i>	Attractive, columnar accent tree; Blue-grey foliage that holds color well in winter; dense branches with a pyramidal shape; slow growing; tolerant of most soil types
<i>Medora, Skyrocket, Woodward</i>	Narrow, columnar in shape; keeps shape with little pruning; hardy; slow growing
<i>Moonglow Juniper</i>	Broad, pyramidal form; bright silver-blue foliage; hardy; resists grazing by deer
<i>Wichita Blue Juniper</i>	Feathery, silvery-blue foliage; open form growth; deer resistant; easy to care for
<b>Pine</b>	
<i>Bristlecone Pine, Pinon, Mugo</i>	rounded, shrubby, slow-growing; drought tolerant; works well in hot, dry exposed areas; adapted to various soil types
